



FUTURE TENSES

1.The train (to arrive) at 12:30.
2.We (to have) dinner at a seaside restaurant on Sunday.
3.It(to snow) in Brighton tomorrow evening.
4.On Friday at 8 o'clock I (to meet) my friend.
5.Paul (to fly) to London on Monday morning.
6.Wait! I (to drive) you to the station.
7.The English lesson (to start) at 8:45.
8.Are you still writing your essay? If you (to finish) by 4pm, we can go for a walk.
9.I (to see) my mother in April.
10.Look at the clouds – it (to rain) in a few minutes.



FUTURE TENSES

- 1. The train **ARRIVES** at 12:30.
- 2.We ARE GOING TO HAVE dinner at a seaside restaurant on Sunday.
- 3.It **WILL SNOW** / **IS GOING TO SNOW** in Brighton tomorrow evening.
- 4.On Friday at 8 o'clock I **AM MEETING / AM GOING TO MEET** my friend.
- 5. Paul IS FLYING to London on Monday morning.
- **6.**Wait! I **WILL DRIVE** you to the station.
- 7. The English lesson **STARTS** at 8:45.
- 8.Are you still writing your essay? If you **FINISH** by 4pm, we can go for a walk.
- 9.1 AM GOING TO SEE my mother in April.
- 10.Look at the clouds it **IS GOING TO RAIN** in a few minutes.
