

-general truths


- FUTURE: fixed arrangements (timetable).





Peter has a shower at 8 a.m. every day



The present simple: NEGATIVE FORM


In English, we write DON'T or DOESN'T before the verb to form the negative

The negative form

You play	You don't play	
He plays	He doesn't play	
She plays	She doesn't play	
It plays	It doesn't play	
We play	We don't play	
You play	You don't play	
They play	They don't play












The present simple: INTERROGATIVE

In English, we write <u>DO</u> or <u>DOES</u> before the subject to form the interrogative

The interrogative form

AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	INTERROGATIVE
I play	I don't play	Do I play?
You play	You don't play	Do you play?
He plays	He doesn't play	Does he play?
She plays	She doesn't play	Does she play?
It plays	It doesn't play	Does it play?
We play	We don't play	Do we play?
You play	You don't play	Do you play?
They play	They don't play	Do they play?
